






Did you know?!

The Advent wreath is an old German tradition, rich in meaning. The wreath is a circle, symbolising that God has no beginning or end. The evergreen leaves symbolise eternal life and the candles symbolise the four weeks of Advent. The three purple candles remind us of the penitential nature of Advent – perhaps a treat could be given up and money given to charity, e.g. for a virtual World Gift for a family living in poverty such as a goat that will provide nutritious milk. The pink candle is lit of the third week of Advent for Gaudete (Rejoice) Sunday, reminding us that Christmas is nearly here! Be joyful!


Greatest Gift
