
# Let's get creative!

Why not make an advent wreath for your door? You can get some fresh greenery from either your local florist or out on a walk!

You can make an Advent wreath with candles for the home to give you a focus and small reminder of this season. Why not bless your Advent wreath with your family? Check out the link on our website for this.

### Did you know?!

The Advent wreath is an old German tradition, rich in meaning. The wreath is a circle, symbolising that God has no beginning or end. The evergreen leaves symbolise eternal life and the candles symbolise the four weeks of Advent. The three purple candles remind us of the penitential nature of Advent - perhaps a treat could be given up and money given to charity, e.g. CAFOD or Mary's Meals? The pink candle is lit for the third week of Advent for Gaudete (Rejoice) Sunday, reminding us that Christmas is nearly here!



#### **CALENDARS**

Have you bought an advent calendar yet? How about a Meaningful Advent Calendar? Telling the real story of Christmas, our recommended Advent calendar also has Belgium fair trade chocolate.

What's not to like?

You can trace the days of Advent with your children using activities linked to the Jesse Tree, which helps us remember the story of God's people, waiting so long for the Messiah, as we wait through Advent for the coming of Jesus.

# TABITHA'S TRAVELS: A FAMILY STORY FOR ADVENT (STORYBOOKS FOR ADVENT)


Why not come together as a family to read an exciting story every day of Advent? "Curious, competent, and courageous Tabitha is the daughter of a shepherd who is taking his family on caravan to his birthplace. Along the way, she meets and becomes friends with Jotham and Bartholomew, watches as Romans take her father prisoner, helps Mary and Joseph just before Christ's birth, and ends her travels at the stable in Bethlehem." This works well for KS2.


#### THE DONKEY'S JOURNEY

How about a beautiful new book written for the younger children. "This story invites children to follow in the hoof-prints of a humble donkey as he travels to a starbright stable in Bethlehem for the birth of a very special Baby Boy". Includes reflective questions for Advent.

Each day they can move the figures a bit closer to the Nativity Set (make sure the wise men don't arrive until 6th January and you have hidden Baby Jesus until Christmas Day!) How about our recommended fair trade nativity set?

Ask your children to place a piece of straw in the manger every time they do something kind/make a little sacrifice until Christmas when they place Baby Jesus in the manger on the straw. Use your nativity set or an Advent Manger Kit.
